international Deaf tennis events including the Dresse Cup, Deaflympics, European Championships and World Championships. In August 2015, Jack

became the first Great Britain deaf tennis player to begin a college tennis

scholarship in the USA. Jack has recently gained a minor in sports

marketing. Jack has inspired his younger brother Toby to compete in Deaf

Tennis. He is also a keen footballer and supports Crystal Palace FC.

Lewis's Story: Lewis started playing tennis aged 14. As a junior he competed in numerous

tournaments around the country including British Tour events. He joined the Tennis Foundation Deaf Tennis Performance Programme in 2001, aged 16.

From the age of 17 he opted to play full-time tennis with the PTR academy in

London and has gone on on to represent Great Britain in numerous international Deaf tennis events including the Dresse Cup (Davis Cup

equivalent), Deaflympics, European Championships and World

Championships. Lewis has built a successful coaching career alongside his playing career and he is currently joint head coach at Ramsbury Tennis Club

in Wiltshire alongside his wife Catherine, whom he met through deaf tennis.

Quote: "I am delighted to be representing GB at my third Deaflympics. To represent

your country is a prestigious honour and to be able to do this playing a game

I love is a bonus.

"My aim for Turkey is to get into a medal position for doubles. A key highlight for me that stays in my mind is my win against the second seed at the 2009 Deaflympics. I will also always cherish the match I played with Catherine at her last ever Deaflympics as a player and it was just unfortunate we had to settle for fourth place and missed out on a medal. But it is still an everlasting

memory and to share that with her made it more special."

Esah's Story: Esah started playing tennis when he was eight years old and first learnt

about deaf tennis through the North London Deaf Children's Society in 2013. He subsequently attended a Tennis Foundation deaf tennis camp at Gosling Tennis Centre. Esah competed in his first National Deaf Championships in 2013, winning the junior event, and he went on to join the Deaf Tennis

Performance Programme in 2014. Later that year he made his international debut for Great Britain in the Deaf Youth Cup in Hamburg. Esah has gone on to represent Great Britain at the 1st World Deaf Tennis Championships in Nottingham in 2015 and the 2016 European Deaf Tennis Championships in

Portoroz. Esah regularly competes in LTA sanctioned events and his sporting hero is Andy Murray. Esah was named Young Deaf Sports

Personality of the Year for 2015/2016.

"I am very proud to represent GB in the men's category in the Deaflympics

because I have never played in this event before, and I am very excited to be

playing it a young age. It will be a new experience, and I hope to take a lot

from it and learn more about being a GB athlete.

"When I am in Samsun, I hope to play the best tennis possible, and try my

hardest in all my matches so hopefully I can do well in them.

"The biggest thing I learned at the European and World Championships was about how to compete at an international level, and how to stay focused throughout an entire tournament, staying hydrated and eating well. I also saw the high levels of tennis from around the world, which has motivated me to

improve even more."
